



## Secondary Education Teacher Certification

For post-baccalaureate students, UMM offers professional coursework leading to Secondary Certification (7-12), in the fields of Art, English, History, Life or Physical Science, or Mathematics. It is possible to complete the certification program within three semesters if all content requirements are fulfilled. In addition to education courses, 24 credit hours in the content area are required. These courses may be completed prior to or after acceptance. Students with foreign educational credentials must submit transcripts for analysis to a credentialing agency.

Additionally, the program requires approximately 110 hours of classroom field placements, which may be accomplished in your local area school.

Additional requirements include maintaining a GPA of 2.5 in professional coursework, and successfully passing the Educational Testing Service's (<http://www.ets.org>) Praxis I Core Academic Skills for Educators and Praxis II Content exam. Passing scores are required prior to student teaching application in October or March of the semester preceding student teaching.

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In addition to meeting any content deficiencies identified in the transcript analysis, students who have already earned baccalaureate degrees and are preparing for secondary teaching certification should take the following:
