The Early College Inclusive Early Childhood Education Pathway facilitates the development of knowledge and skills related to working with young children who have special needs. Coursework emphasizes the theoretical and practical exploration of typical and atypical child development, as well as methods for supporting children and families through the stages of child development. Strategies for professional communication with coworkers and families are also a focus.

Completion of these programs allows students to pursue careers in the following fields:


