~ Campus Accommodations & Parking ~

When we are able, semester courses are held on the UM@M campus. All buildings and rooms on the UM@M campus are wheelchair accessible. Parking is free at UM@M, but you must have a parking sticker, available in the Student Affairs Office on the second floor in Powers Hall.

~ UM@M Merrill Library Privileges ~

One of the privileges of current paid membership in Sunrise Senior College for permanent and seasonal Maine residents is the use of Merrill Library on the UM@M campus. Your courtesy card allows you to check out items in the Merrill Library collection, and use the URSUS request function for requesting items held in other URSUS libraries. You also have access to the library computers.

To obtain a Merrill Library courtesy card with privileges:

- Report to the library front desk with identification and proof of Maine mailing address (this must be a photo ID Maine driver's license or state ID, passport, or any government issued photo ID. If a mailing address is not on the ID, the applicant must provide proof of residency with a recent utility bill, property tax bill, lease or rental agreement, or motor vehicle registration.).
- Applicants must present proof of current membership in Sunrise Senior College (a receipt for yearly membership or a registration confirmation).
- You will be asked to complete a courtesy card application form whereby you will agree to comply with the rules of the University of Maine at Machias and Merrill Library and to accept financial responsibility for all items borrowed on the card. To renew your Merrill Library courtesy card with privileges:
- Report to the library front desk and present your courtesy card and proof of current membership in Sunrise Senior College (a receipt for yearly membership or a registration confirmation).

Using the Merrill Library facilities:

- Your courtesy card is required for all transactions.

Singing Out in the Age of Sail – Part A

with Dr. Stephen Sanfilippo Free for SSC members

Tuesday: August 8th

11:00 AM to 1:00 PM – In-Person only held in UM@M's room

Science 102

This is the first of a two-part presentation "Singing Out in the Age of Sail – Part A." Since 1973, Dr. Stephen Sanfilippo has been researching and performing historic songs of the maritime trades. In this first session you will learn the important role of chanteys in the work of sailors in 19th century America. Please become engaged while listening and learning about the many different types of chanteys that were used.

Stephen will tell us about the history, folklore and meaning of these songs and then you can listen as he performs them in the manner done by the men on these sailing ships (you will have the opportunity to join in on the chorus). It is NOT necessary for students to have any musical training to enjoy these wonderful tunes. You will be able to hear some ballads sung by seamen while they were off watch.

The Ballads being discussed are found in "Bygone Ballads of Maine," volume 1: "Songs of Ships & Sailors," and Stephen will be discussing them and comparing them with ballads with similar themes found in the research done with his wife Susan here in Downeast Maine and in Suffolk County, New York. With some of the ballads presented, you will have the opportunity to hear early field recordings by traditional singers of these ballads.

Presenter: Dr. Stephen Sanfilippo has a Ph.D. in History and has done extensive research into the period between 1840-1850. He is a performer of historic songs of the maritime trades since 1973. Stephen is a retired assistant professor, Maine Maritime Academy, teaching "Maritime History through Historic Songs of the Sea," and is an organizing member and leader of a monthly Chantey Sing at Pembroke (Maine) Library since 2006.



Singing Out in the Age of Sail - Part B

with Dr. Stephen Sanfilippo

Tuesday: August 15th

11:00 AM to 1:00 PM – In-Person only held in UM@M's room

Science 102

Did you miss "Singing Out in the Age of Sail – Part A?" Why not attend this second session that builds on what was discussed during the first session.

In this presentation, Dr. Stephen Sanfilippo will continue to discuss the important role of singing in the life and work of the sailors in the middle half of the 19th century. Become engaged in learning more about historic songs of the maritime trades that he has researched - the chanteys are of wide and far origins and many of the ballads are from Maine. Learn more details about why the chanteys varied and how they assisted the sailors in doing the hard work being done on the ship.

Stephen will discuss many interesting details about the songs and then you can listen as he performs them in the manner very similar to way the men on these ships sang them (you will have the opportunity to join in on the chorus). It is NOT necessary for attendees to have any musical training to participate in singing these chanteys. You will also hear and discuss ballads by seamen when they were off watch.

The ballads being discussed are from found in "Bygone Ballads of Maine," volume 1: "Songs of Ships & Sailors," and Stephen will be discussing them and comparing them with ballads with similar themes that he found in his research with his wife Susan here in Downeast Maine and in Suffolk County, New York. With some of the ballads being presented, you will have the opportunity to hear early field recordings by traditional singers of these ballads.



The Winter's Tale is Shakespeare's often-forgotten masterpiece. A mixture of comedy, tragedy, and romance, it asks difficult questions about love, friendship, marriage, suffering, and redemption. We will work our way through the play both by careful reading of the text and by considering its relationship to Christian martyrs. In other words, we'll make comparisons to the lives of early martyrs, using a few short readings and some works of art. No, The Winter's Tale does not seem to have anything to do with faith - *Or does it??????*

Instructor: Dr. Gerard NeCastro was a professor of English and Humanities in Maine for twenty-two years, teaching everything from Composition and Creative Writing to World Literature and Shakespeare. His signature class was Introduction to Humanities, which worked back and forth between literature and visual arts. His favorite classes were with the Sunrise Senior College scholars. He has since moved to West Virginia, where he has been Dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Professor of English.

In this four-session presentation, Dr. Stephen Sanfilippo will provide an in-depth look at the early development, history and ongoing tradition of songs of the maritime trades using the materials discovered in his many years of research in Suffolk County, New York, and used in his teaching at Maine Maritime Academy where he taught Maritime History through the study of historic songs of the sea. Using "Bygone Ballads of Maine," you will look at songs and stories about seafaring that are timeless. Stephen has discovered many Maine ballads or Maine versions of ballads during his research - these Maine ballads will be put into the wider context of English language ballads from many other countries. These songs, drawn from recordings and archives of Maine singers and collectors, tell a powerful story of sailing, fishing, storms, shipwreck, piracy, sea battles, and loved ones left at home.

Cranberry Harvesting Tour – Lynch Hill Farm

(Rain Date: Wednesday, October 18th)

Lynch Hill Farms is located in Harrington, a small village on the coast of Maine, where the Hammond family owns and operates the farm that has been in existence since 1975. There they grow America's three native fruits—wild blueberries, cranberries, and grapes, as well as shiitake mushrooms.

Cranberries can be harvested in one of two ways - wet or dry harvesting. In a wet harvest, the cranberry beds or bogs are flooded and the fruit is "beaten" off the vine using a reeler. The floating fruit is then corralled and pumped into bins. Wet harvested fruit is sold wholesale and used for processed cranberry products like juice and sauce. All of Lynch Hill Farms' cranberry bogs are dry harvested where they use a walk behind mechanical harvester to gently pull the berries from the vines. No water is involved in this process and ensures their freshness and longevity for their customers!

Come tour their farm and learn how they harvest their berries so that they are fresh for you.

Presenter: Courtney Hammond is a member of the Hammond Family. His parents, Robert and Helene, were raised in Harrington and raised their five children on the farm, instilling in them a strong work ethic. The family has blossomed over the years and there are now twenty-five of them.

Have you ever seen those fancy looking multi-colored vases, glasses or bowls in the stores and thought "how pretty and interesting"? Do you have any of these things hanging around that you can't seem to get rid of but don't really use? What about those old Christmas ornaments that just don't seem to fit on your tree anymore? Are you intrigued by those paintings that look like pools or puddles of color, some of which display a marble-like effect?

This class will teach you how you can create your own fancy glassware, paintings and Christmas tree ornaments through the art of either paint pouring or painting on glass whether using new items to start or if you want to breathe new life into ones you'd like to repurpose. It's easy and fun and you'll be able to say "Wow - I did that!"

Instructor: Suzie O'Clair has been very interested in all kinds of artistic venues: paint pouring/painting on glass, weaving, enameling, sandblasting, fabric arts and working with wood. She has taught herself how to paint pour creating Christmas ornaments for gifts using both new and old ones and updated vases and bowls through the art of painting on glass.

Supplies required for this class:

Acrylic enamel paint, rubbing alcohol, modge podge – glossy, mixing cups, glass/plastic Christmas tree ornaments, glass vases/bowls, small canvases, sheet pans, paintbrushes, hairdryer (students can bring their own items from home to repurpose – vases, bowls, glasses, ornaments for the Christmas tree)
